St Peter's receive awards for Sport

Our school has recently received two awards that acknowledge and celebrate the wide range and high quality sports provision available both within the curriculum and also extra-curricular. The AfPE Quality Mark was awarded in May and was quickly followed by

the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Award, the highest level achievable and one of only a few schools on Wirral to have been awarded this. A huge vou to evervone involved in PE and sports at St. Peter's with a special mention for our PE lead, Mrs Penn, who has worked so hard over a number of years to develop and enhance our PE and sport provision across the school.



One example of our success in sport was demonstrated on Friday 8th July when St. Peter's took 4 teams of children to represent Wirral at the Merseyside Youth Games at Wavertree Liverpool. A prestigious event which saw schools from all over Merseyside compete across 17 sporting events to become overall Merseyside champions – the best of the best.

This year's event had a Rio-inspired flavour, building on the excitement as the world approaches the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Brazil. Over 1200 children took part representing one of the six boroughs of Merseyside - Halton, Knowsley, Liverpool, Sefton, St. Helens and Wirral. St. Peter's took a team of Year 5/6 Quad Kid Athletes, a Year 5/6 Tri-golf team, a Year 3/4 Mini Red tennis team and a Year 5/6 Boccia team.

Every child worked hard for each other and tried their best. Well done. We are delighted to say that both the Quad Kids team and the Boccia team finished runners up, meaning that St. Peter's have the second best athletics team and boccia team in the whole of Merseyside. A tremendous achievement!
