St. Peter's Top Awards for Sport

took four teams to
the Merseyside
Games at
Wavertree. This is
a prestigious event
which sees the top
schools from
Merseyside
competing against



each other, whilst representing their borough. St. Peter's competed against schools from Liverpool, Halton, Sefton, Knowsley, St. Helens and Wirral in trigolf, quick sticks hockey and quad kids athletics (two teams). All of the children performed to an exceptionally high standard and they represented our school and Wirral very well. Both the hockey and trigolf teams finished 5th, and for the second year running the quad kids team finished 2nd making them the 2nd best team in the whole of Merseyside - a tremendous achievement and one to be very proud of.



At the end of June, the new age kurling team also went to Liverpool to represent Wirral in the Merseyside final. This is a sport which is very similar to the game played on ice; however, it is played

indoors with competitors firing their stones in turn towards the target. The team performed brilliantly together with each child having a different role: to knock an opponent's stone out of the way, to block a stone or to score on the target. After three wins and two draws in the group stages, St. Peter's finished 2nd in their group on goal difference and made it into the 3^{rd/} 4th playoff. A fantastic set of 4 ends saw St. Peter's winning by 5-1 collecting bronze medals.

Cressida was a fantastic and inspirational speaker; the children and adults were hooked from the moment she started.
