






### Reading- 2 papers

- \* Each paper is worth 50 per cent of the marks.
- \* Around 30 minutes each, but not strictly timed. They are not intended to assess children's ability to work at speed.
- \* The texts will get progressively more difficult towards the end of the test.
- \* Teachers will have the option to stop the test at any point that they feel is appropriate for a particular child.

### Reading- 2 papers

#### There will be a variety of question types:

- Multiple choice
- Ranking/ordering, e.g. 'Number the events below to show in which order they happened in the story'
- Matching, e.g. 'Match the character to the job that they do in the story'
- Labelling, e.g. 'Label the text to show the title'
- Find and copy, e.g. 'Find and copy one word that shows what the weather was like in the story'
- Short answer, e.g. 'What does the bear eat?'
- Open-ended answer, e.g. 'Why did Lucy write the letter to her grandmother? Give two reasons'

- Ensures consistency year on year allowing variation in the tests
- On the scale, 100 represents the national standard
- Results from the tests will be included in the end of year report
