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Coast 2 Country Project









During the Summer Term, our school has been lucky enough to be involved in a project called Coast 2 Country. The project is in collaboration with other schools in the local area. The main focus of the project was to raise awareness about ways in which we can look after our local environment which then extended to looking after our planet. One avenue we explored was looking at ways to reduce our use of plastic and the importance of recycling.

On 24th June, two Year 3 children had the opportunity to visit Jaguar Land Rover with other children from local schools. The children toured the factory and were told how the cars were made and they also looked at how the factory recycles its waste products.

Each school taking part in the Coast 2 Country project were invited to produce a 3D art sculpture (see below) of an endangered animal. The children had to use recycled materials to create the sculpture.

All the sculptures are now on display at the Williamson Art Gallery and Museum in Birkenhead, during the Summer Break.
