School Library



As part of our ongoing work on developing awareness and respect for diversity we will be starting a programme called No Outsiders in school after the half term break. This is a series of age-appropriate books that cover different aspects of the Equality Act. It is not about promoting any lifestyle or belief system but to give children an awareness of diversity across all cultures. It is about creating a culture at St Peters where there are No Outsiders. Everyone is welcome and everyone is valued regardless of race, religion, sex, orientation, age, disability and so on. There will be series of worships on this based on the story of The Good Samaritan, the key message



being 'Love Your Neighbour' and the understanding that anyone is your neighbour as we are all members of the human race. There are then specific books for each year group that reference different aspects of the Equality Act.

As a school we would like to give you the opportunity to have a look at the books and they will be on display in the library after school on Wednesday 7 May from 3:20pm. Mr Wallace will also be there in case you have any questions.
