St. Peter's CE Primary School is committed to providing high quality education and sport for all our children.

This includes:

- The progressive teaching of fundamental skills
- A wide breadth of physical activities and sports
- Opportunities for all children to engage in competitive sport and activities
- Encourage children to develop specific skills and talents
- Working with local partners such as local sports clubs, volunteer and private providers

The PE and Sports Grant was introduced by the government. Schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil. This is calculated on the number of children between Year 1 to Year 6, as recorded in the January Census.

Priority Areas For 2021-2022

- The engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- Qualified sports teacher to work alongside staff with the delivery of PE and Games sessions
- Enabling children to attend inter-school sporting events and activities
- Additional sports coach to provide lunchtime activities. Coach to supervise and create games to engage the children
- Continue to develop cross-country running in school and to participate in Wirral school competitions
- Upgrade sports kits and equipment
- Update planning and schemes of work
